



## Senior Project Youth worker

<b>Days</b>	Wednesday - Friday
<b>Hours</b>	22 per week, flexible times, plus opportunity for overtime.

**Main aim of the role:** To work with young people across the organisation assisting in the management of a Youth Café, assisting with social skills workshops and building one-to-one mentoring relationships.

- Working closely with the FST team to plan, deliver, evaluate and develop Infuse.
- To work with the FST team delivering personal and social development workshops to excluded young people, encouraging the group to engage and develop.
- To build positive relationships with young people, inspire and motivate them.
- To act as a positive role model.
- To demonstrate an understanding of the issues faced by young people.
- To work with the young people to increase their access to educational and youth services.
- Keeping accurate records of attendance, registrations and evaluations using our online database system.
- Using social media platforms on a regular basis to communicate with our young people.
- Attend regular team meetings.
- Complying with the organisational requirements for health and safety, child protection and other policies.
